this House urges upon the Government to bring forward a suitable legislation for substituting the nomenclature of tribe 'Dhangad' by 'Dhangar' in entry 36 of the list of Scheduled Tribes in respect of the State of Maharashtra."

"This House expresses its grave concern over 'exotic birds' trade in India in gross violation of the provisions of the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1960 and India's commitment to the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) and urges upon the Government to take immediate steps to prevent trade of wild exotic birds listed by CITES and initiate stern enforcement of laws and regulations to check illegal capture of non-indigenous species of wildlife that are being smuggled into India."

(ii) ensure availability of public amenities such as toilet, sewer, water pipeline and drinking water in such slums till formulation of the Slum Redevelopment and Rehabilitation Scheme."
